### From the Rector: Get ready for "Katie Day"

There is a prayer in our Book of Common Prayer which appears in four places -- and yet we only pray it one time each year, plus on very rare and special occasions. It is a wonderful prayer which concludes the Solemn Collects on Good Friday. The other times it is prayed are ordinations, for three orders.

If you missed it on this past Good Friday, you don't have to wait a year; you can join in praying it as we celebrate the ordination of our Curate, Katie Osweiler. While her actual ordination will be in Ohio the week before, on Sunday, 29 April we will have our own celebration, both for her to re-affirm her ordination and for us to officially mark her ministry with us as an ordained person.

O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of your providence, carry out in tranquillity the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

When we pray this on Good Friday we are reminded that no matter how dark and hopeless the world is, God is and has always been working it out and transforming our world, even at a moment when God's own son was dying on the cross.

This Good Friday we could look at the world in despair -- with horrible violence and hateful government policies abounding -- just as those at the foot of the cross despaired that all was lost. Of course we found out only three days after the cross that all was not despair. And in time, we will see the same for our world, in spite of the news we see and read of oppression and injustice in so many places.

When we pray this prayer at ordinations, we have in mind that the service of this person is a part of God's plan for the good of the world. The one who is called to the role we celebrate is an instrument of God's great plan.

We will rejoice that after many years Katie is ordained, a visible sign of God's goodness and transformation for our world. From the time she's been with us so far we have already experienced her gifts as a preacher and a pastor. Now she will stand at the altar, the one who invites Jesus' presence in the bread and wine which become his body and blood; and she will now confer forgiveness and blessing in his name.

So we will celebrate God working out another part of new creation in our community -- a fitting day of rejoicing in the middle of the Eastertide!

### Abbreviated highlights of the Vestry meeting of 19 February 2018

- 1. Nick Fern opened the meeting with a **prayer**.
- 2. **Vestry check-in:** Nick led a discussion about concern over the size of the church's debt. Are other nearby churches doing well financially? Have people in general stopped coming to church? It was noted that the original purchase was a bold and frightening commitment. A huge amount has been paid off, not just from the Campbell money but generous gifts of others over the years. Many ways of paying it off or securing further loans have been studied. The current congregation is not as financially flexible as the congregation was when the purchase was initiated. But the congregation should be reminded regularly of the debt, as well as made aware that Vestry does discuss, research, and take it seriously.
- **3.** Reflections of members whose terms end: Laura Atlee said that on vestry you realize how everything in church comes together. She and her family will leave Belgium in early July.

Bill described how he volunteers for smaller things and they expand, especially since he lives nearby and is retired. He will continue to lead through the Convention.

Nick will continue to serve. (He had originally only agreed to finish this partial term.) The rector and Vestry members gave thanks for the particular insights and gifts that were contributed by Laura, Bill and Nick. Sunny reported that Dominique-Hélène Lemaire has an ongoing schedule conflict with Vestry meeting time and will not serve an additional term. Names were suggested for candidates for new Vestry members.

- **4. Plans for AGM:** Reports need to be in from the various committees in order to be circulated.
- 5. Ministry and committee reports:

### Outreach

a. Katie Osweiler will attend a meeting soon for the Relay for Life event and will share the information with the congregation.

### Finance & property

- a. Mike Breton distributed copies of the 2017 accounts. These cover everything except the asbl. (The asbl account has all the building income and all of that money is used to pay back our lender, so it does not impact our operating budget.) A motion was carried to accept the 2017 accounts with thanks.
- b. Mike presented the proposed budget for 2018. A motion carried to accept the 2018 budget. Mike was thanked for his work on the figures.
- c. The outstanding debt to our lender now stands at €833,000. All Saints' aims to pay the lender at least €50,000 in 2018. €8,000 has already been sent.

- d. Mike met with the ING bank regarding whether they could envisage a loan for us. The bank said that it wouldn't be easy, but there is a basis for discussion. "We are exploring all possibilities for loans."
- e. Mike found invoices from the builder who worked on the roof several years ago and asked for their estimate for the necessary work.
- f. ASC has reduced usage enough to have a slight reduction in the electricity bill for 2018. We will pay €298/month instead of €311 at a time when the rate is increasing.

### **Formation**

a. Michael reported that Katie has done a wonderful job getting the Sunday School organized with material and resources, which have been a great hit with the children.

### **Convention 2018**

- a. Bill has booked the Bois d'Arpes for the Bishop's Banquet on the Friday evening. The Thursday reception is now only for the Episcopal clergy and C of E council. Other participants will dine in groups at local restaurants.
- b. He reported that the sign-up sheets have attracted the first few volunteers.

### Fellowship

- a. Turnout had been low at Mardi Gras but those who stayed had a great time.
- b. The new Fellowship committee will help to organize a summer picnic in Hannah and Nadia's garden.

### 6. Curate's report

This week is the meeting of the Conference of Bishops in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America which will determine what they want to do with Katie. Fingers crossed this means she will be able to set a date for her ordination. She thanked everyone for their support and encouragement during this transition time. She said that it's been quite a journey and she's happy to be with All Saints'. She enjoyed the clergy retreat in Catania. Spending time with the other priests in the Convocation was encouraging and educational.

### 7. Rector's report

Sunny reported that she's very concerned about Charleroi where attendance is down and many members have been sick. The Mons services are going well. She reported that Katie is taking on helpful leadership.

8. Nick read a **closing prayer** and the meeting ended at 21.24.
