From the Rector: Admas

It's time for the annual culture war. How do we keep a holy Advent season, as its own special time, while all around us this time is treated as Christmas? Part of getting ready for Christmas is shopping and eating and celebrating, while the official teaching of Advent is that we have a time of prayer and acknowledging that we are not living ready for Christ's return and judgment.

This culture conflict is mirrored in a little way with a tension we have here within All Saints'. Going back in church archives 30 years ago there were tensions resulting in the publication of words that are in our weekly program: *Before the service speak to God; during the service let God speak to you; after the service speak to one another.* The issue is: how do we keep a holy time before worship, as a special time for prayer, while we're excited and happy to greet our fellow parishioners as we arrive at church? Our regular pre-worship differences are a micro-version of the bigger seasonal question.

There is good reason and a need for both, spiritually and emotionally.

Some people have a lot of noise and chaos in their lives. They look forward to sitting in the holy space of the church, quietly praying and collecting their thoughts before worship, and listening to the music which our dedicated musicians have been practicing and preparing for us to hear.

Some people have had events in their lives which they are excited to share, and want to hear the news of fellow parishioners as they arrive before worship. As we come together to pray with and for one another, we include fellowship as a part of how we begin the service.

The problem of course is that those who want quiet want quiet, and those who want to speak want to speak.

In the same way, some people appreciate Advent as a time of prayerful reflection: "...we await his coming in glory." In Advent we pay attention, listen, and as we await his coming we examine our hearts and minds and lives and get ready, preparing for the most special one to be with us.

But also, some people think of Advent as a time of hustle and bustle, of favorite songs and decorations and merriment, readying for the celebration this way.

Just as there are those who are annoyed at not taking the season seriously, there are also jokes in church circles about "Advent Police" who "arrest" the merry-makers before Christmas.

Somehow, we all need to make space for both approaches. The one who came and comes again found a world with many, many different kinds of hearts, all longing for the prince of peace in their own ways. So it remains.

Report from Convention at Wiesbaden

This year, in October, we traveled to Wiesbaden, Germany for the Convention of the Episcopal Convocation in Europe. I had to pleasure of being accompanied by Fiona White, as we were again selected to be representing delegates of All Saints' Episcopal Church of Waterloo this year. Wiesbaden is a very beautiful city, with lots of style and charm, along with the Church St. Augustine of Canterbury, Wiesbaden. It's a very beautiful parish with very gifted and talented parishioners, with Rev. Christopher Easthill as its rector. They have offered to give us any feedback, and advice to help us with our upcoming convention in 2018.

I didn't arrive in time for the opening ceremony, but we got straight to work with a very busy Agenda schedule. I will give a summary of the most highlighted things I took away from the Convention.

I had the pleasure of meeting Janet Day-Strehlow from Munich Germany, who gave a presentation on European Institute of Christian Studies. I found her to be a valuable resource for people in leadership roles, such as: Rectors, Senior Wardens, Junior Wardens, Treasurers, Secretaries, and all new members in leadership roles. There will be conferences to attend for those who are interested in Academy for Parish Leadership (APL). These will take place 27-28 April in Florence, 15-16 June in Paris, and 22-23 June in Nurnberg. If anyone is interested in attending this please let me know, and I will put you in touch with her.

We talked about the coming election of the new bishop, and what that would bring. We were given a presentation from the Rev. Canon Michael Hunn from New Mexico, who showed us a video from our Presiding Bishop & Primate, Michael Curry on the Jesus Movement. Rev. Hunn also explained in detail how the nomination process would work: we do not contact the search committee to nominate a candidate for Bishop. Rather we approach the candidate we feel would be a desirable choice and encourage them to apply to the search committee.

If you are interested in having more details of the meetings that took place in convention, please feel free to ask me for copies of our agenda, along with copies of the financial reports from the Convention, etc.

150 Syrians to be welcomed in Belgium

All Saints' Church is a significant co-sponsor of the project 'Humanitarian Corridors', which is being coordinated by the secular Christian community Sant'Egidio. This project is going to welcome 150 Syrians who will arrive in Belgium from Turkey and Lebanon on humanitarian visas. These refugees, who would normally be accommodated by Fedasil, will be looked after by several different religious communities. Once they arrive here, they will be able to make a request for asylum and start to build their new future.

To achieve this, an agreement has been reached between the Federal Government, Sant'Egidio and all the Recognized Religions in Belgium (Catholic, Anglican, Protestant, Orthodox, Jewish and Muslim) to collaborate to welcome 150 extra Syrian refugees to Belgium during the next 12 months. All the candidates will be assessed in advance before being given permission to travel to Belgium. Once here, they will undertake a one-year program, intended to support their integration pathway.

The Anglicans' part in this agreement is to welcome, take responsibility and provide this support program for one Syrian family of four people for a maximum of 12 months. Sant'Egidio has estimated that it will cost €17,000 to look after four refugees for a year. Currently the Anglican total stands at €14,000 but with the way the fundraising is going, the remainder will be raised very shortly.

The following is a list of points which we can all think about:

Does any parish have suitable accommodation available (or knows how to find it) for a family of two adults and two children?

Does any parish have expertise in stewarding the legal side of negotiating the asylum process for refugees?

Does any parish have access to clean clothing for the refugees, suitable teachers in French or Dutch, a friendly general doctor, or further ideas about how the family can be helped to integrate into Belgium when they arrive?

If you can offer help or information, please inform Rev. Sunny. Remember this is a family supported by all Anglicans in Belgium so they may not be housed in our vicinity. However, every parish can offer help in the form of furniture, clothing, finance, etc.

Summary of the Vestry meeting held on 16 October 2017 at 19.30 at All Saints' Church, Waterloo

Present: Rev. Sunny Hallanan (Rector), Michael Smets-Tolley (Senior Warden), Laura Atlee, Mike Breton, Bill Bythell, Bob DeWitt, Nick Fern, Nadia Molenstra. Staff: Fiona White

1. The meeting opened with a **prayer**.
2. **Absence:** Dominique-Hélène Lemaire
3. **Vestry check-in:** As follow-up to Invite-Welcome-Connect, Rev. Sunny Hallanan ran an exercise taken from *Beyond Business as Usual – Vestry leadership development*. Vestry members described their first church, what size congregation, the type of music sung, etc. All those present bar two remembered large congregations of between 50 and 300 people, traditional music, large choirs and large numbers of children in Sunday School. One's first image of church is the one you revert to in your memory: traditional music, being known to fellow church-goers, large or small congregations, etc.

The images of our early churches color our response to how we expect a church to be. We don't want to burn our leadership out but the size and program will be determined by the leadership style. It is easy for churches to shrink if leaders do all the work and burn out.

Vestry will ponder these ideas and discuss how we at All Saints' can lead to grow and support the parish more.

4. **Ministry and committee reports:**

Fellowship:

- a. Laura Atlee was thanked for organizing the Bishop's dinner on 6 October.
- b. Plans were made for Remembrance Sunday and Thanksgiving Feast.

Outreach:

- a. Mike Breton will send the €85 raised from September's bake sales to Episcopal Relief & Development. In addition, €150 will be sent to Community Help Service.

Finance & property:
