## From the Rector: What do you carry with you?

*‘These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: “...Take no gold, or silver, or copper in your belts, no bag for your journey, or two tunics, or sandals, or a staff...”’ (Matthew 9)*

As I write this I am overwhelmed by my stuff. Not, in this case, the vast amount of things piling up in my office and apartment. But the stacks of items lined up on my dining room table. Somehow, they all must fit into the one backpack I will carry through a jungle on the way to the Lost City, on my vacation next week. The instructions say pack lightly, but they list the many situations I will face which require additional supplies. It all adds up to a heavy, over-stuffed bag.

And then of course, I do see the things I’m not taking, that I consider to be necessities for my everyday life. There is so much stuff. I’m afraid I learned one lesson from my mother too well: “The day after you throw something out, you will need it – so find a safe place to keep it, just in case.” Oh, how I regret that before I moved to Belgium I got rid of a big bag of perfectly good shoes, thinking those heels will never come back in style – and now of course they are the height of fashion.

All this stuff! Jesus says don’t take it. Just don’t take it!

Carry the minimum amount with you, and it will be sufficient.

So, I turn my thoughts to the things I carry with me that are not material, but can also weigh me down. To get the most out of hiking through the jungle with my daughter and soon-to-be son-in-law, it would be good if I do not carry all the clutter of things that are emotional and spiritual burdens.

These things that I should not carry include grudges, regrets, prejudices, dwelling on losses, anger, hostility – and most of all, anxiety. *“And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to your span of life?... But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.”* (Matthew 6)

Instead, I need to fill my bag with hope, curiosity, an open-spirit, trust, readiness to forgive and be forgiven, faith, and rejoicing in the beauty and wonder of God’s good world always.

What will you carry with you this summer?

May your bag be filled with God’s true blessing, wherever you journey!

## The All Saints' Cycle of Prayer

On the following page you will find the up-dated version of our cycle of prayer, which includes, notably, changes in our Outreach projects and Youth ministry.

The purpose of this cycle of prayer is to ensure that every aspect of our communal life is remembered before God day by day, week by week. It is essentially a tool for guidance; an aide-memoire, if you will. Above the headings are the names of our clergy, who encourage all our endeavors, and their families. Next, you will notice that there are seven columns. Each refers to an area of our concerns and activities, but can also represent a day of the week and a focus of prayer for that day; for example, the column headed 'All Saints' as a member of Convocation' could be the focus for Sunday, etc. Originally it was designed to help those members of the Prayer Chain, who promised to pray daily for our church and it still serves that purpose. However, it became clear that members of the congregation might also appreciate this 'tool', so, usually annually, this document is updated, the better to reflect our current concerns and is published in *Saints Alive!*.

The Prayer Chain hopes that you will feel moved to join in this prayer. It shows just how much is going on in our midst. It is also fascinating to recognize that each activity depends on the dedication of an individual or group of members ... who are they? ...what are their names?

Hannah, to whom I owe huge thanks, has helped put this document together and we submit it for your use and, we hope, your joy in supporting All Saints' differently.

## Summary of the Vestry meeting held on 15 May 2017 at 19.30 at All Saints' Church, Waterloo

The meeting opened with a prayer.

**Approval of minutes from the last meeting:** The point about 'struggling with behavior' at Sunday School was discussed and it was decided to leave it in when the minutes are published in *Saints Alive!* to show that the matter is being addressed. The minutes of the April Vestry meeting were approved.

### **Vestry check-in:**

At Invite-Welcome-Connect in Munich, the ASC group needs to update those present on church life in Waterloo. What should they say? The points mentioned were: Sunday School is going well – we now have 22 children; we have a beautiful building, are able to reach out to the community, we are welcoming and we do well with Outreach.

Ministry and committee reports:

### **Convention 2018:**

Further to Bill Bythell's report submitted by email, he told the meeting that he had accepted the offer from Ibis Hotel, Waterloo for 50 rooms at €59 p.p. per night, bed and breakfast. (After these rooms are taken, others attending will have to find another place at a higher rate.) The Convention will be based at All Saints' Church. Sunny outlined the program over the four-day meeting and stipulated that she would be involved 100% with the Council of Advice and thus not available to deal with food, furniture, transport, etc. It is imperative that volunteers block the days out in their diaries. **Date: 18-21 October 2018**

### **Fellowship:**

Laura Atlee has the food in hand for 18 June when we have the Sunday School Gala. Sunny will organize something for the children to give to the Sunday School teachers.

Vestry members were reminded to pay special attention to welcoming newcomers, rather than just talking with people we already know after church. The rector and associate mentioned who some of the newer and returning members are.

### **Outreach:**

The mission ingathering at Pentecost will go to Episcopal Relief and Development as a thank you for their support to us and the work of other Convocation churches. We are not serving a desperate population at the moment. A shower and washing facility has just opened; maybe there will be a second one developed in the near future that we can use the ERD money for (the original intention was to buy a washing machine and dryer with these funds). The shelters are now closed for the summer.

## **Finance and property:**

Mike Breton reported that the fire department saga is ongoing. We need to install more fire doors, a new Velux and an extra fire escape. The quote for the work from Sicli is €6,000. The Vestry decided that we should go ahead and get this work done. We have loose roof tiles and Land Rover has a cherry picker on site at the moment. They have been asked to help us get the tiles replaced in return for their vehicles parking on our land.

Money is still coming in. Mike feels we now have our maximum number of 2017 pledges: 30. He will be sending €10,000 to our lender this month.

## **Formation:**

Jennifer Blanco-Marvik reports that all is going well. The young children are getting ready for their party. Rite 13 is ready for Paris. A trip for the 'in-betweeners' will be organized before the end of term.

Sunny held a communion class for children, classes preparing for baptisms at Pentecost, and a couple of Bible classes. Classes will be offered for confirmation preparation for the Bishop's October visitation. Grete and Robert are being married by Mark Barwick at ASC on 27 May, and he has done their preparation classes.

## **Other business:**

Follow-up on Handford Fund use: A couple of suggestions were made: replacing the floor covering in Campbell Hall; a highly visible church sign on the front of the building above the windows. It was stressed that unless specified, Memorial Funds are not intended for everyday expenses, but rather for special projects which might honor the person in whose memory they were given. No decision was made so this will be discussed again in June.

The Roman Catholic Church have changed their French translation of the Lord's Prayer. Sunny explained that changing this in our written worship texts would need to go before the General Convention of the Episcopal Church before we can use it at ASC, as it is a change to the Book of Common Prayer authorized by the church.

## **Associate's report**

Mark reported that finding meeting space for the church in Mons is ongoing. He will be in Mons on Trinity Sunday morning for their special service.

## **Rector's report**

Next month's meeting is a regular meeting. There is no meeting in July. All committee reports should also be sent to Fiona so that she can include them with the minutes.

The meeting finished at 21.25 with a prayer.
