From the Rector: Lent continues

Like most Episcopal Churches, All Saints' offers its building to host Alcoholics Anonymous meetings. It is important to be a welcoming place for this valuable resource for recovery and spiritual healing. Because it does provide anonymity as part of what makes it successful, I try to keep out of the way of meetings, so I do know when participants are likely to be around the Community Entrance of the church.

One of the things I've notice over the years is that the church parking lot is always more full on AA nights in January, as people are trying to keep New Year's resolutions. But by February, the number of cars has gone back down. Unfortunately, the original enthusiasm for change and self-improvement wears off.

This same pattern happens to many of us with our Lenten resolutions. On the first Sunday in Lent, those many petitions of the Great Litany reminded us how much we need to resolve to be faithful this season. But gradually, other involvements take us from our resolutions. Or maybe, we got part-way into Lent and never really had resolutions this year anyway ... the season snuck up (or sneaked if you prefer) on us, because Epiphany was so short this year.

The wonderful thing about The Church is that it anticipates our lapses. And it counts on God being a God of continual renewal. So it's not really about what we do, or don't do. It's about what God does, in transforming us – patiently! And in Holy Week, ultimately, we remember it is all about what Jesus does for us, not what we do.

If we have not been keeping a Holy Lent can start NOW. Today! This moment. Pray:

"God, there are things I've done I shouldn't have. And there are things I haven't done that I should have. Help me right now to begin anew, and walk with me to and through Holy Week."



- B. Regular Vestry meeting attendance meetings are usually the 3rd Monday of each month, and quorum is needed.

When members are absent their input is missed.

If a member must miss a meeting, it is important to take the initiative to find out what was discussed so the whole Vestry does not have to repeat matters already covered.

- C. Workshops / Retreats
 There is an important All-Vestry Retreat on Saturday, 13 April.
- D. Attendance / support of parish functions.
- E. Personal commitment of time / talent / treasure.
- F. Committee Responsibilities

 Each Vestry member is liaison to one committee, to support, help lead, and report back to the Vestry regularly. The committees are decided at the annual Vestry retreat.
- G. Reporting

Regularly prepare and deliver a timely monthly committee report to Vestry. Prepare and deliver an annual report outlining efforts of Committee and any future plans committee has to offer the parish for inclusion in the Annual General Meeting Report

- H. Be a constructive team player: have a positive attitude and desire to be a part of the solution.
- I. Have an understanding of church and traditions.
- J. Be committed to the future growth of All Saints' as a parish community.
- K. Have a commitment to confidentiality

- When the list of candidates has been finalized, biographical and other information about the candidates will be posted.
- It will also include other information about the Convocation, which will assist
 persons who are interested in the bishop search process, including a description of
 the Convocation Parishes and Missions.

Summary of the Vestry meeting of 15 January 2018

- 1. Michael Smets-Tolley opened the meeting with a **prayer**.
- 2. **Vestry check-in:** Michael posed the question: How did we all end up at All Saints'? A wide variety of stories were shared.

3. Finance & property

- a. Mike Breton reported that it is not possible to set up a second signatory for the US bank account without them appearing at the bank in person.
- b. €841,342 is outstanding on the building loan. The lender has made suggestions as it cannot continue indefinitely. We currently do not have a way to pay it off more quickly (€45-50 000/year) so we may need to look at alternatives. (It is not possible for the church building to be used as security.)
- c. New president of the Fabrique: Alasdair White is happy to replace Mark Barwick.
- d. Replacing the church van: we need something similar to what we have now, a petrol or hybrid which can carry 6 passengers. The budget can be €5-10,000.

Formation

- a. Michael met with Katie Osweiler and agreed to continue to center the Sunday School (SS) lessons around the weekly Gospel readings. Katie will meet with SS once a month.
- b. All the teachers are doing a wonderful job but more are still needed.
- c. In an effort to involve the children more with worship, a gong bowl is rung by one of the children at the start of services.

Convention 2018

- a. Volunteers have begun to sign up to help during Convention. More are needed.
- b. Bill is continuing to negotiate with venues for the Bishop's Banquet.

Fellowship

a. Laura Atlee reported that Mardi Gras is the next fellowship event. Laura will purchase the necessary food but is unable to be there herself.

Outreach

- a. Katie reported that there was a good turnout for the recent open meeting after church. Many suggestions were put forward including supporting a week for children in the summer and LGBT ministries for 18-20 year olds.
- b. She had a positive meeting with Brenda Barleycorn.

4. Other business:

The AGM will be held on 4 March, after worship. Plans were made for presentations and discussion at the AGM, and nominees for new Vestry members.

3. Curate's report

Katie reported that things are going very well. She's learning more about the church and helping with Outreach and Formation.

4. Rector's report

Sunny said that Pledge Sunday will take place this year in late February.


We have a short Epiphany this year but attendance so far has been quite good. Most of the Christmas services went well. The 11 am (4 Advent) on the 24th was surprisingly well attended, as was the 5 pm service on Christmas Eve. However, only eight people came to the 11 pm service on Christmas Eve. We keep Arend van der Toorn in prayers as he recovers.

The Convocation Council of Advice (of which our rector is president) will be in town, 25-28 January. Their first meeting of the year is always at the venue for that year's Convention, which helps to plan the meetings having seen the space available.

There were only eight people in the congregation at Charleroi yesterday. Many of them are not well at the moment but they're hanging in there.

The Bishop will confirm two people at Mons on his first visitation there, on 28 January.

were received into the Episcopal Church. You probably recognize Schola and Emilienne, as they've been worshipping with us at All Saints' for a while now, making the long commute from Mons with the Nahimana family. They are part of the core leadership for the new congregation. Bishop Whalon explained how Mons can apply for official "Mission" status with the Convocation, and that process is now beginning. You are welcome to attend our next service there, at 15h30 on 25 March.
