From the Rector: September is Homecoming time

“Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep.” *Romans 12:12*

This past week at All Saints’ was a time of joy and sadness, as we said goodbye to people who are dear to us, while also wishing them well in their adventures ahead.

It is a time of year of transition for many. For some, nature is making it a disastrous time – in Sierra Leone, Nigeria, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Houston – among others. For others, human cruelty is disastrous.

Compared to the situations others face around the world, our sorrows may seem insignificant. But still – they are our sorrows. They are real and heartfelt. And they are, in truth, what tends to occupy our thoughts more than those of the wider world. We can pray and try to send relief for others. We may cry or dance in honor of news of events of distant peoples. But honestly, day to day we are most inclined to think and act in relation to our own personal, direct situations.

The good news is that God’s got the whole world in God’s own hands. And Jesus Christ came here for all of us, everywhere. But even Jesus himself, while he fed and showed compassion for thousands, still kept with a smaller group of closer friends for his prayer and sharing of his deeper feelings. In spite of the tendency to think bigger is better, it is in a smaller community that we find our deeper meaning, and are most challenged to personal faithfulness.

So our parish is meant to be our faith home. We may travel away, as many of us did over the summer. But we have this home to come back to. And in the ideal configuration we aim for our church home to be a place where we pray, sing, learn and care for one another in a deeper way. Our baptismal promise is to seek and serve Christ in all persons. Our congregation is a place to practise this, to strengthen one another and find God’s loving wisdom and courage to then carry this out to the wider world, and take concrete action to help those in need, near *and* far.

This Fall we will miss those who are no longer in our community. But we will welcome others. We will need to try to fill the empty spots left by those who are not here, inviting the Spirit to bring forth new gifts. That’s why we have a Mission Fair every September. Maybe we already know we have all these committees and opportunities to serve – but we need to renew some things, and sometimes we may choose to step back from one area of involvement – or try a new one, even if we are unsure of our abilities to succeed.

So WELCOME HOME. Even if you have been here all along, every time someone leaves or arrives, our home is a little different, and so are we. And always, Jesus is here, inviting us to share his love.

What are each of these?

- Baptism** Full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's body the Church.
- Confirmation** In the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the Bishop. Those baptized as adults have their belonging confirmed as part of the one Holy Apostolic succession by the Bishop.
- Reception** A person who has already been confirmed in another denomination [with the laying on of hands in apostolic succession] is welcomed into the episcopal fellowship of the Episcopal Church.
- Reaffirmation** A person who has been confirmed and wishes to make a public recommitment of their baptism.

(an informal eucharist, which is conveniently scheduled so that if you can't come to church because of No-Car Sunday, you can still come to this service.)




Come for Pizza & the Movie at 6 pm

Summary of the Vestry meeting held on 19 June 2017 at 19.30 at All Saints' Church, Waterloo

Present: Rev. Sunny Hallanan (Rector), Michael Smets-Tolley (Senior Warden), Mike Breton, Bill Bythell, Bob DeWitt, Dominique-Hélène Lemaire, Laura Atlee
Staff: Fiona White

The meeting opened with a **prayer**.

Absence: Rev. Dr Mark Barwick (Associate), Jennifer Blanco-Marvik (Junior Warden), Nadia Molenstra

Approval of minutes from the last meeting: The minutes of the May Vestry meeting were approved as submitted.

Vestry check-in: What will be the one thing people will be focusing on improving during the summer? For some it will be reconnecting with family; for others getting fit, maintaining a prayer life when on holiday, improving their patience, reading, and gardening.

Ministry and committee reports:

Formation:

- a. The Youth/Rite 13 went to Youth across Europe in Paris. All the youth had a wonderful time.
- b. From 13-15 October, the Convocation Youth Leaders' retreat will be here at All Saints'. There will be around 15 people attending. Please note the dates; help will be required to make this run smoothly.
- c. It was suggested we have an adult Sunday School before church.
- d. It also suggested swapping the English and French readings around more frequently.

Convention 2018:

- a. Venues are being investigated for the Bishop's Banquet on the Friday evening of Convention in 2018.

Fellowship:

- a. We had a successful Sunday School Gala on 18 June. The next event for Fellowship is the Mission Fair on 3 September. For No-drive Sunday (17 September) we will again have a pizza supper and Movie Night following a service on the Saturday evening.

Outreach:

- a. Bob had sent around information about 'Frigo Solidaire', a system where a fridge is placed on a property, left-over supermarket food is put into it, and needy people come

to collect it. A team of 60 volunteers stock the fridge, and unlock and lock the fridge each day at specific times. Rev. Sunny said there were three stipulations:

i. One parish representative must be on call 24/7 and it is not to be her, Mike Breton, Fiona or Alasdair White.

ii. We must have a copy of their insurance cover in our files.

iii. The fridge is not to be open when the scouts, guides and AA are using the building. If these conditions can be met, the Vestry agreed to a three-month trial. (No one offered to be the person on call.)

b. Waterloo Uncovered is back from 10-21 July. In the past we have helped with the catering. There is an opportunity for volunteers to get involved.

Finance & property:

a. The work to bring the building into line with the additional precautions outlined in the last report of the Zone de Secours from the Commune/Fire Dept. have been finalized. The work is scheduled to be completed during the week of 2 July. Florence Colleaux of the Bio-Babies crèche has been kept in the picture as she needs the final approval of the Fire Dept. to expand her activity. A date for the final inspection will be requested during July after the work has been completed. We should be able to pay for the work required out of the current account.

b. The amount going to Episcopal Relief and Development is \$600.

c. A transfer of €10,000 has been made to our lender. We anticipate making a further payment in July in line with the schedule.

d. The half-yearly assessment payments to the Episcopal Convocation and the Anglican Council of Belgium have been made.

e. Sunny had read a report which said that 21% of 11-18 year olds are coming to their faith inspired by going into a religious building.

Other business:

1. Three-month review of cleaner: Georges is doing a good job, so it was decided to have him continue coming for four hours on Tuesday afternoons.

2. **2018 AGM date:** As EICS will hold workshops for Vestry members and Wardens next spring, the date of the 2018 AGM has been set for 4 March.

3. **Invite - Welcome - Connect:** All Vestry members had been asked to watch videos relating to the workshop that four members from All Saints' had attended recently. It touches on many good points but the speaker's ideas are based on parishioners' proximity to the church. We also have a language barrier. The whole workshop had been about growing and developing the church, creating events, like lessons & carols, thanksgiving, etc., which is what we're doing. We are growing but not fast enough. What else can we do? Can we reach more people in a way that works?

4. **Parish directory to remain staff only, or for the whole parish?** We need to connect more with our parish. Sunny proposed that the staff-only page is made available to parishioners. We will need to abide by the Data Protection Act and offer every parish member an option to opt out. The meeting was in favor of trying this using the option mentioned.

Rector's report

Sunny reported that the Dean of the Cathedral in Indianapolis has resigned due to developing a severe form of dementia. She is a well known preacher and is coming to Europe for the fall. She will preach at ASC on 26 November on her illness: 'Dementia from the inside out'.

ICB are unable to be with us to sing a mass this Remembrance Sunday. However, some of the singers will join the church choir to sing some special anthems.

Michael Tolley offered to teach the children songs to sing in worship on the Sunday when the Bishop is with us on 8 October.

Sunny asked if anyone wanted to change the Vestry committee they were on. As Formation is somewhat up in the air, Michael will stay put. Bob will also help out with Fellowship. Dominique-Hélène Lemaire wants to use her skills following the art exhibition she organized for ASC. She has many contacts in the music world and music festivals are always looking for new venues.

The meeting closed with a prayer.
